YOUR CHILD'S HOROSCOPE

VIRGINIA, E. S. — Born May 4, 1910, 12:30 a.m., Schenectady, New York.

At the time Virginia was born, the saturnine sign Capricorn was rising with Uranus, the erratic, spasmodic planet, sextile to Venus and square Saturn, the planet of obstruction. The cardinal signs always give a great deal of energy and this spends itself without trouble so long as it is allowed to go its rhythmic way, but when it is checked in its flow by Uranus' spasmodic vibrations it becomes like a horse held in leash, chafing and tugging at the bit, impatient and out of sorts. So it is with Virginia. There is a great deal of energy latent in her nature which is denied expression by the obstruction of Saturn, and this paves the way for the irritable vibrations of Uranus, so that she is often gloomy and out of patience with everything and everybody about her.

It is the privilege and the duty of her parents to help her form the habit of cheerfulness. Above all, she should not be scolded so long as there is any possibility of correcting her by reasoning, for harsh words will cause her to brood over real and fancied injuries and thus she will form a very bad habit.

The Moon is square to Mercury, the planet of mind, but trine to Mars, the planet of dynamic energy; thus we see that there is an inner struggle of the mind and an aspiration which seeks an avenue of expression. This is also shown by Jupiter

being trine to Mercury; and that the basic nature is benevolent we may judge from the fact of this configuration, for Jupiter represents the higher idealistic side of being.

Venus is the planet of attraction and beauty. She is placed in her exaltation sign in the watery Pisces, a fact which accentuates the basic characteristics of her nature. She is also in the second house which deals with finance; thus we may judge that Virginia will always attract money. She will have no occasion to worry concerning the amount of money which she may spend within reason, but Venus is square to Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, showing that Virginia will want to throw the money out of the window as fast or faster than it can come in by the door; also, she will spend it on dress and finery. This is a tendency which the parents ought to discourage by all means in their power. Dress serves a useful purpose in developing the artistic nature, but is bad when it is overdone and becomes a mania. There are many other things in life which are of greater importance that call for attention.

The Moon is the principal significator of health for a woman, and we find in the case of Virginia that the Moon is trine to Mars, the planet of dynamic energy. Therefore, we may conclude that she will have a considerable store of vitality, which is something unusual for a Capricorn person, as they are generally lacking in life force on account of the saturnine obstruction. Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is also sextile to Mars, assuring Virginia quick recovery when sickness does overtake her.

CLARENCE W. J. — Born Sept. 3, 1914, 5:30 p.m.,
Winifred, Montana.

Here we have a youngster of a fine, kindly disposition, for Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, is rising in the humanitarian sign Aquarius. It is trine to Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, which gives us our temper if we have one. But in Clarence's case, Mars' influence is softened because he is in the gentle Venus sign Libra. Therefore, he will not express temper, but his energy will be used in benevolent channels as indicated by the trine to Jupiter. This is an exceedingly fortunate configuration, for he who has the spirit of philanthropy which makes him love to do good thereby attracts the same from others, and will therefore live an exceedingly happy and prosperous life. There is only one flaw in this matter: Mars is impulsive, Uranus is still more so, and we find Uranus conjoined with Jupiter, trine to Mars. This configuration of Uranus with Mars and Jupiter will give Clarence the tendency to throw discrimination to the winds, and what he gives to, or does for, people will probably not do half the good it would do if expended with care.

But it costs money to be philanthropic in a large way, and the question, "Where is he going to get it?" is therefore pertinent. The same planets which show how he is inclined to spend also indicate the source of supply. Mars in Libra, and unafflicted, is very constructive; he tends to make that which is beautiful. His trine to Uranus, the planet which governs electricity, the ether, and all the new inventions which will make the Aquarian age a thousand times more wonderful than the dreams of Jules Verne, will put Clarence

in touch with the World of Abstract Thoughts and Ideas. From the cosmic mind he will learn principles and laws of which we do not dream, also how to embody such things in epoch-making inventions. Moreover, he is not alone in that line, for during the seven years Uranus is going through the sign Aquarius, there is being born a new race of such marvels. When they grow up to be 15, 20, or 25 years of age, the world will hear from them. Things we never imagined in our wildest dreams will become part of our everyday life, and probably the present wonders of the world will be out of date altogether.

Mars, which gives Clarence the required energy to work out his plans, is ruler of the second house, which governs finances; his trine to Jupiter, the planet of opulence, guarantees abundance of funds; and as Jupiter rules Sagittarius, which is on the tenth house, indicating social honor, we may also judge that Clarence will be highly esteemed in the world.

We find another trine between Saturn, Venus, and the Moon; each is so placed that it is trine to the other two. The Moon is a significator of the mind; it is conjoined with the benefic Dragon's Head in the first house, and trine to Saturn. This adds depth to the instinctual mind and will probably act as a needed brake upon impulse, for the close conjunction of Mercury, the planet of reason, with the Sun, makes it certain that he will not be guided by logic, but will do as he *feels* is right.

The saturnine Dragon's Tail in conjunction with the Sun, in the sign Virgo, which rules the intestinal region, gives a tendency to digestive trouble; this testimony is further augmented by the square of Neptune and Venus. Neptune

is on the cusp between Cancer, which rules the stomach, and Leo, which rules the heart. This shows that Clarence will be overfond of dainty things to eat, and that the system is likely to become clogged in consequence. The distended stomach pressing upon the heart will then add to the distress. Dyspepsia is the bane of many a life which would otherwise be happy, and the parents should practice frugality so that Clarence may learn in childhood, by their example, to form wise eating habits, and thus save himself much misery.

WOLCOTT B. — Born June 28, 1905, 12:45 p.m.
New York City.

The editor has often held that the so-called "bad" aspects in a horoscope are our best teachers in Life's School, for they bring out the noblest virtues in us when we have had their whippings; also, that where there are no "bad" aspects, the person is so good that he is good for nothing. Looking at Wolcott's horoscope and seeing the many splendid aspects we became concerned at first that there was nothing "bad," till we found Uranus in opposition to the Sun and Neptune, also Saturn conjoined with the Dragon's Tail. That saves him, and we know he is going to be all right.

The first thing we note in Wolcott's horoscope is the two groups of three planets each in the eighth and ninth houses, highly elevated, and therefore in strong positions to affect him for good or ill according to the aspects. There is Mercury, the planet of reason, conjoined with Neptune, its higher octave, which gives a deep insight into spiritual things that is

much higher than the intuition generated by Uranus, the octave of Venus. Mercury is also conjoined with the Sun, the source of all light and knowledge, yet not so closely as to be combust. Thus we have the full strength of these three planets focused through the ninth house, which rules the mind and religion. Furthermore, they are all trine to Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, and two of them are trine to Saturn, the planet of tact and diplomacy, giving Wolcott an active, well-balanced mind of a very unusual calibre. As this powerful configuration occurs in the ninth house, it is a question whether the mentality will seek its expression in the service of the state, as judge or legislator, or, in the church as a minister. Jupiter and Venus, the planets of rhythm and beauty, conjoined with the Moon in the sign Taurus, which governs the vocal organ, shows that he has a beautiful voice either for speaking or singing. So he has the oratorical power necessary to clothe his thoughts in speech in such a manner that he will attract attention in whatever field he chooses. But Neptune, the mystic planet, conjoined with Mercury, and the Sun in the psychic sign Cancer, will inevitably draw Wolcott to the church, but not to one of the orthodox variety, and in this field he will be a powerful leader.

Jupiter, the planet of opulence, is usually generous in all directions. His influence makes one feel that he has plenty, and need not be stingy. Venus is also inclined to be bountiful, and these characteristics may be expressed toward the person himself, as well as with respect to others. Here Jupiter, Venus, and the Moon are in Taurus, the sign which rules the palate. Wolcott will therefore be very fond of the so-called "good" things to eat. He likes his food highly seasoned,

rich, and generously supplied. This inevitably leads to trouble. Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is conjoined with the saturnine Dragon's Tail in Pisces. This reacts on the opposite sign, Virgo, which rules the intestines, and interferes with the process of digestion, making him dyspeptic. At least, that is the tendency, if you do not take adequate steps to curb his appetite and teach him self-control in that respect. He may take up fads in food, and add to the trouble, as shown by Uranus opposition the Sun and Neptune in Cancer, the sign which rules the stomach. It is the parents' duty to set a good example for him by eating wisely.

Jupiter, Venus, and the Moon in the eighth house show that Wolcott is in line for some legacies. Mars essentially dignified on the cusp of the second house, which rules finance, and trine to the Sun, shows that he will have a splendid earning capacity, too. However, it also shows that he will be prone to spend it impulsively, as fast as it comes.

MARIE ELIZABETH H. — Born July 31, 1911, Newton, Mass.

Here we have a rather delicate little girl who will need special care from her parents, for Cancer, a sign of low vitality, is rising, and the Moon, which rules the Ascendant, is square to Neptune and Uranus. The Sun, which is the great reservoir of life, is also square Mars, the planet of dynamic energy. But do not be afraid that she may not live, because we enumerate all these malefic influences; we are just taking stock and looking the facts in the face, so that

we may govern ourselves accordingly. One person may start out in life with a great big fortune, and by riotous living dissipate it all in a few years, while another, who has but little to begin with, may husband it skillfully and acquire a competence before the close of life. As it is with money, so also with our bodies and life force: riotous living will undermine the strongest health, and intelligent care will make a weak body strong. Thousands and thousands drag out existences of miserable invalidism or go down to early graves because their parents were ignorant of the need of strengthening their bodies in early childhood. Perhaps they thought that somehow their child would "grow out of it," when, had they but known, the horoscope showed a basically weak constitution which should have been strengthened by persistent systematic efforts during childhood — the earlier begun the better.

The root of Elizabeth's trouble is a weak heart and poor circulation of the blood, as shown by the square of the Sun to Mars, the energizer, and Jupiter, which governs the arterial circulation. Too vigorous exercise will make her heart palpitate and should therefore be avoided, but carefully graded gentle calisthenic movements, practised daily under the proper guidance, will work wonders. At the same time, careful attention should be paid to her diet, for Neptune is in Cancer, the sign which rules the stomach, and the Moon, which governs Cancer, is square to it from Libra, the sign ruling the kidneys. This shows that, as a result of the impaired vitality, digestion will be weak and the elimination of fluids by way of the kidneys will not be good. She needs good nourishment, which at the same time is easily digestible. If you can possibly get it, we suggest milk fresh from the cow,

or better still, goats' milk. There is nothing to equal it for building her up. Coarse, whole-wheat bread is also needed, both for its nourishing qualities, and its stimulating effect on the peristaltic action. Mars in opposition to Jupiter, which is in Scorpio, the sign ruling the rectum, conjunction with the saturnine Dragon's Tail, shows the need of this.

We also find that the Sun is in conjunction with the Ascelli, a nebulous spot in Leo six degrees, and square to Mars. The Moon, the other luminary, is square Neptune. This indicates that care should be taken of Elizabeth's eyes during childhood. Guard them against strong sunlight, and go with her to school to see that she is so placed that the light does not hurt her eyes. This configuration also indicates that her spiritual sight may be easily developed, but the adverse aspects show that it would not be desirable. She should never be allowed to attend spiritualistic or kindred meetings.

To sum up, you have a child that needs all the care you can give her in all directions, but forewarned is forearmed. There is no cause for alarm if reasonable precautions are taken before trouble develops.

DONALD R. D. — Born May 26, 1912, 7:50 p.m.,
Tonopah, Nevada.

At Donald's birth the zodiacal sign Cancer was rising. This is a sign of scant vitality, but as Mars, the great energizer, is in the first house and sextile to the Sun, the life-giver, Donald will have plenty of vitality, notwithstanding. This configuration will strengthen the heart, for Mars is on the

cusps of Leo, the sign which rules that vital organ. Were it not for this sextile, the opposition of Mars, from the sign of the heart, to Uranus, the planet of irregularity, would have caused palpitation, which is happily averted. It would be well, nevertheless, to guard him against violent exertion during the years of growth.

While on the subject of health, we may also note the conjunction of Saturn and Venus in Taurus. Taurus rules the throat, and Saturn, the stellar agency of obstruction, is also naturally cold. Therefore, this configuration warns us that Donald will be subject to swollen tonsils, which will obstruct the throat, and that is the point where he is liable to catch cold. When he is sixteen or seventeen years of age this condition will be the worst, because then the Moon will be passing through Taurus and vivify the affliction. But be not alarmed, the planets have shown you the weak spots, and you have ample time and the best of opportunities to strengthen that part of the constitution.

It is best to inure the throat to cold from childhood, and above all, do not allow the tonsils to be removed. They serve a purpose in the body and by patient rational treatment, such as massage, the circulation can be kept free in the earliest years until the weakness has been overcome. Usually an affliction in one sign carries with it a weakness in the region governed by the opposite sign. Thus, an affliction in Taurus, which rules the throat, would also affect the part of the body which is under Scorpio, namely, the eliminative organs, causing obstruction of the urine or constipation. In this horoscope, however, we find the disturbing factor, Saturn, beneficently configured with Mars, the ruler of Scorpio,

and we may therefore judge that Donald will not be troubled by this reflex action. That is a great point in the preservation of health, for where there is regular and thorough elimination of waste from the body, disease does not easily take root.

Donald will never be a good reasoner, for Mercury, the planet of logic, is in an intercepted sign, and unsuspected, but the Moon, which rules the instinctual mind, is in good aspect to Jupiter, the planet of benevolence. The cosmic light-giver, the Sun, is also in favorable configuration with Uranus, the planet of intuition. Thus Donald will be guided by impressions and feelings: his nature will be psychic and sensitive, as shown also by Neptune being placed in the first house in the psychic sign Cancer. He will therefore be unfit for ordinary worldly life, and will tend to shut himself off from others at an early point in his life. He will be a lonely boy, misunderstood in his surroundings, and he needs the sympathetic care of his parents in a greater degree than most children on that account.

This lonely, introspective childhood will prepare him for his work in the world, an important humanitarian work, as shown by the second, sixth, and tenth houses. On the second house governing finance, we find Leo, the sign of the heart, and, did you ever know anyone with a big heart that had also a full pocketbook? That kind is, we believe, scarcer than the proverbial "hen's teeth." The ruler of the second house, the Sun, is in opposition to Jupiter, the planet of opulence, and Mars, the planet of prodigality, is on the second cusp, showing that Donald will always be poor in the world's wealth because he will be extremely open-handed. We learn also, though, that he will be rich in heavenly treasure, which

he will not have to leave behind when death marks the time of reaping what he has sown, for Jupiter, the planet of benevolence and idealism, is essentially dignified in Sagittarius, in the sixth house. Jupiter is in good aspect with the Moon, the planet of fecundation, and Sagittarius is the sign of religion, philanthropy, etc. This shows that a life rich in opportunity for noble service awaits Donald.

He may never become widely known, for Jupiter, the ruler of the tenth house, which governs social standing, has only two aspects, but I would rather have his horoscope than that of a multi-millionaire philanthropist who spends money on "institutes" and kindred grand schemes which advertise the donor widely. The kindly, personal touch of a true Samaritan who feels with, and for, his suffering brother is worth more in actual soul-growth than all such impersonal charities, and Donald has one of the "luckiest" horoscopes I have ever come across. May he live up to it and grasp the opportunities it presents.

ALICE LOUISE J. — Born May 3, 1910, 6:30 a.m., Providence, R. I.

Here we have a little lady with a mind as bright as a new dollar, for the intellectual, scientific sign Gemini is rising with Mercury, its ruler, near the ASC, and trine to Jupiter, another significator of mind, in the sign Libra. This position of Mercury, the planet of speech and reason, will also give Alice the ability to express herself. She will indeed have an unusually glib tongue, for Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, is parallel to Mercury; that brightens and quickens

both wit and speech to a wonderful degree.

People who have that configuration *alone* are often veritable chatterboxes, whose tongues are continually wagging unmeaning words at somebody. This is not the case with Alice, though, for Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is in Aries, which rules the head and brain, and sextile to the Moon, another significator of mind. This adds depth to the mind and makes her tactful, self-reliant, and persistent, so that whatever end she seeks to gain, she will always persevere until her object is attained, particularly since the Moon is situated in the MC, which governs the social position. This shows also that Alice will be fitted for a trusted position of a public nature, and the ruler of the rising sign trine to Jupiter, the planet of expansion, shows that there will be a general success in the whole life. The planets being scattered over the whole horoscope shows that she is of a versatile nature who can fit in any place, and such people are always sought. In all probability she will choose a literary career, and it would be well to shape her studies accordingly.

Regarding the nature of the faults latent within her, we learn from the square of Mars to Jupiter and Venus that she will be inordinately fond of dress and pleasures, exceedingly extravagant, and so generous that she may give away her last dollar, even though in want herself. Also, she is apt to be insanely jealous concerning anyone she loves. Mars square Venus also gives a liability to suffer from slander, and Mars square Jupiter shows a tendency to loss through indiscreet speculation. When you know these latent faults, naturally you will also realize how best to apply the remedy. With respect to this inordinate fondness for dress, it may

probably be curbed considerably, or else led into a constructive channel, by teaching her how to make her own clothes and design them in an artistic manner. The parallel of Mars and Mercury makes her extremely dexterous, quick, and bright. She will without a doubt enjoy the opportunity to exercise her creative ability in an artistic direction and from the years of childhood her dolls should be given to her with material from which she must make the clothing for them herself. Then she will naturally in later years use the faculty to adorn her own person.

With regard to the impulsive generosity shown by Mars square Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, it would probably also be best to teach her by object lessons. If you let her give her things away and then feel the loss, it is likely to cure her, for a child of her nature will feel very intensely upon any subject. The tendency to excessive jealousy can also be dealt with in the home, especially if there are a number of brothers and sisters. Do whatever you can to eradicate this trait, for it is one of the most painful feelings and the victims thereof are very much to be pitied.

With respect to her speculative tendency we would advise that you allow no card games in the home and speak disparagingly of gambling and speculation outside the regular channels of business. So much can be done toward moulding the character in the earlier years, and any fault which is not too firmly ingrained can be eradicated by the precepts and example of the parents, especially the latter.

Venus, the planet of love and art, is in favorable aspect to Uranus, the planet of intuition and inspiration. This will make Alice very intuitive, so that as a rule she will not need

to reason things out, but will have the solution as soon as the problem is presented. From the aspects between these two planets (Venus and Uranus), Alice will also receive a marked musical ability. The positions and aspects of Mercury, already spoken of, give her great dexterity and so, without a doubt she will become a high class performer, as well as an inspirational interpreter of music. We have no doubt that you will give her every opportunity to cultivate this latent talent.

Uranus is the ruler of the eleventh house sign, which governs friends, and Venus, the planet of love and attraction, is in the eleventh house in Pisces, its exaltation sign. This position and the aspect of Uranus shows that Alice will have many friends who will be of great benefit to her, and her success in life will come through their efforts as well as by her own capabilities. But, as we said before, she is also liable to be slandered publicly. Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is in the twelfth house, the house of sorrow, trouble, and self-undoing, and a person who has these configurations should be far more circumspect in his or her conduct than other people. Actions which may seem perfectly innocent and natural in one may be taken up and made much of in the other. You may, therefore, save her a great deal of sorrow if you can get her to understand this point and avoid all appearance of evil just as much as she would the evil itself.

With respect to health, we find that Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is in Aries square to Uranus, the planet of spasmodic action, in Capricorn. It is a rule that planets which are in signs that govern parts below the trunk have a reflex action in their opposite signs, and we may therefore judge

that Uranus will be active in Cancer, which rules the stomach. On that account Alice will be subject to severe attacks of headache at uncertain intervals, and you will also find that a great deal of the trouble comes from the stomach. Therefore, she should be taught the virtue of frugality from the earliest childhood, for the stomach is also afflicted by the presence of Mars and Neptune in Cancer. There is no more miserable person on earth than a dyspeptic forced to eat and unable to digest; life is truly a burden for such people, and anything you can do to aid Alice in averting that fate will surely be a worthwhile blessing to her.

HAROLD A. B.—Born Nov. 6, 1913, 3:10 a.m., Columbus, Ohio.

This is a young man who is going to let people know when he is about. No quiet little mouse is one who has cardinal signs on the angles! Harold wants the center of the stage, and with Mars, the planet of dynamic energy right up in the midheaven, you may be sure he will secure attention and push to the front. From this it is not to be inferred that he is a bombastic braggart—not at all. Venus on the ASC, essentially dignified in the polite, pleasing sign Libra, and well aspected to Moon and Saturn, will give him an attractive personality that will naturally bring attention. Saturn in the mercurial sign Gemini will give him tact and balance, and the Moon in the intellectual sign Aquarius makes him quickwitted.

Thus Harold is bound to become a very fine young man who will merit the leadership to which he lays claim. Mer-

cury, the planet of the concrete mind, is in good aspect to Uranus, the planet of intuition; this will make him very intuitive and quick to grasp whatever he wishes to investigate. The Sun in the energetic sign Scorpio, which occupies the second house, rules finances, and it is also in this house, well aspected to Jupiter, the planet of opulence. This indicates that Harold will have an abundance of this world's goods.

But wealth is a responsibility. Blessed is the man who sees in it a trust, and holds it as a steward would hold his master's property. If we abuse it, it may become a curse and ruin us, soul and body. This is the danger Harold is facing, for Mars, the ruler of the second house, is highly elevated and square to Venus on the ASC. This tends to make him very domineering, especially with the opposite sex, yet prone to lavish presents on them, for his own ends. This position also indicates a liability to contract disease on account of amorous indulgences. On that account it will be necessary for the parents to lay aside all false modesty and educate Harold thoroughly in this matter. He should be taught to reverence the generative function, to feel the sanctity of motherhood and fatherhood, to look with the deepest respect upon all women, and to know the frightful consequences of abuse of the divine function of procreation. Thank God, the horoscope shows only *tendencies* which may be fostered or suppressed by will, and there is every reason to hope that you will be successful in training him rightly if you apply yourselves to the task, for the configuration occurs in cardinal signs. Had the signs been fixed it would have been much more difficult to overcome the tendency.

Saturn, the planet of cold and obstruction, is in Gemini,

the sign which rules the lungs. This shows a tendency to cold which will settle in the lungs; but as Saturn is well aspected to Venus and the Moon in the other airy signs, Libra and Aquarius, there is no danger of any serious trouble. At the same time it is well to be careful, especially in the earlier years. Mars in Cancer, the sign which rules the stomach, square Venus and Jupiter, shows that Harold will enjoy the pleasures of the table more than is good for him; teach him to eat with discrimination. He has a keen wit, and will see the wisdom in time if you practice the precepts you preach to him. However, it will not help him if you teach him to be frugal and live to please your own palates. Then he will probably be all the more determined to have his fling when your authority over him has passed with the waning years.

ELIZABETH B. B.—Born Nov. 19, 1910, 8:30 a.m.,
Long. 91 W., Lat. 41 N.

At the time of Elizabeth's birth Sagittarius was rising, but even though its ruler, Jupiter, is the most elevated planet, we must consider the Sun life ruler, for Jupiter is in aspect with only two of the planets, while the Sun is unafflicted and in aspect with four. The saturnine sign Capricorn is in the first house, and if there were no other configuration to offset this influence, it would make Elizabeth gloomy and morose, but the powerful position of the Sun dispels the gloom and changes the nature. The Sun is conjoined with Mercury, the planet of reason, and Venus, the planet of love

and beauty; it is sextile to Uranus, the planet of intuition, and trine to Neptune, the planet of spiritual perception.

Thus it is plain that Elizabeth will have a kindly nature, good reasoning faculty, reliable intuition, and deep spiritual perception. These faculties will come to the surface with the passing years.

The Moon also lends her aid in forming the mind and disposition. We find her in the psychic sign Cancer, trine Jupiter and Mars. This makes the mind still more benevolent and gives activity. Elizabeth will not content herself with dreams, though she will have them in abundance, but she will strive to make her dreams come true, with regard to both spiritual and material things. She will not have a great deal of this world's goods to do with, for Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is in opposition to Jupiter, the planet of opulence. However, that is no drawback, for one who gives *herself* bestows a greater gift than gold. The Sun, Venus, and Mercury in the eleventh house, denoting friends, hopes, wishes, and aspirations, show that Elizabeth will have the love and help of a host of friends who will aid her to realize all she ever can dream of. Thus her life will be lived to an unusual fullness.

It is said that a prophet is not without honor save in his own country, and unusual characters are often misunderstood in their homes, where they are looked upon as "odd." Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is principal ruler of the first house which describes conditions during childhood. He is in the fourth house, which signifies one of the parents, and in opposition to Jupiter in the tenth house, which describes the other. This shows that there is a difference of opinion

between the parents, or that it will develop, so that one will want to restrain Elizabeth's tendencies and mold them in the conventional channels as shown by Saturn, while the other will favor expansion as signified by Jupiter. Caution and conservatism are good, but too many "don'ts" are apt to spoil life for children and make them long to break away. The parents thus lose their chance to guide an Ego that came to them for help. Parents should realize that it is wrong to demand that, because they love a child, that child must efface itself entirely and do just as the parents wish. The opposition of Uranus, the planet of spasmodic action, to Neptune, the planet which, physically considered, brings confusion, in the sign Cancer, which rules the stomach, shows that Elizabeth will develop a strange taste in food. However, there is nothing to show that her method will have a detrimental effect on the system, and it must therefore be rational, whatever it is. Saturn, the planet of obstruction is in Taurus, the sign which governs the throat. He is opposed by Jupiter, the planet of expansion. This shows a tendency to enlarged tonsils. Be careful not to remove them, for at the time of puberty they will become normal again. The Sun, Mars, and Jupiter in Scorpio, the sign which rules the private parts, shows that the menses will be extremely copious, but do not be alarmed; there is no indication of danger, and in time the condition will subside. Be careful to strengthen the throat in childhood; that may prevent the swollen tonsils.
